Hoy vamos a resolver una de las dudas más comunes en inglés: el uso de some y any. Las dos palabras tienen un significado parecido, por lo que es muy fácil confundirlas.

Para referirse a sustantivos incontables directamente, se usan las palabras **some** y **any**.

Como norma general, **some** se aplica en las oraciones afirmativas, mientras que **any** se usa en las oraciones interrogativas y negativas.

Is there **any** sugar?
¿Hay azúcar?



Yes, there is **some** sugar.
Sí, hay algo de azúcar.



No, there isn't **any** sugar.
No, no hay nada de azúcar.

EXCEPCION: Se usa **some** en preguntas cuando se está ofreciendo o pidiendo alguna cosa:

Would you like **some** sugar in your tea?
¿Desearías azúcar en tu té?

Could I have **some** water, please?
¿Podría traerme agua, por favor?

Is there **any** pencil?

¿Hay algún lápiz?



Yes, there are **some** pencils.

Sí, hay algunos lápices.

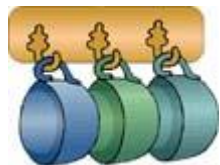


No, there isn't **any** pencil.

Sí, hay algunas tazas.



No, there isn't **any** cup.
